(WEST PRINCES STREET AND COLQUHOUN STREET, HELENSBURGH) (SPECIAL EVENT) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2016

On Monday 7th November 2016, Argyll and Bute Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 16(A) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, with the consent of the Scottish Ministers under Section 16B(1)(b) of the said Act, made the above named Order the effect of which will be that for a temporary period, for the purpose of facilitating the Winter Festival, no person shall drive or cause to or permit to be driven any vehicle through the sections of road on the dates and at the times as indicated in the schedule below.

SCHEDULE – PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC

- (1) **Friday 18th November 2016 1800 hours to 2000 hours** West Princes Street (Colquhoun Square) extending from its junction with Sinclair Street to its junction with James Street.
- (2) **Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th November 2016 0800 hours to 1800 hours** West Princes Street (Colquhoun Square) extending from its junction with Sinclair Street to its junction with James Street. Colquhoun Street extending from its junction with West King Street to its junction with Colquhoun Square.

The restrictions imposed by this Order, which are desirable because of considerations of public safety and convenience during the event, will be in operation when indicated by signs.

Exceptions will apply to any vehicle which is being driven upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or an event steward; an emergency services vehicle; or an authorised vehicle associated with the organisation of the event.

Alternative routes will be signed in an appropriate manner.

Colquhoun Street extending from its junction with West King Street to its junction with Colquhoun Square.

The restrictions imposed by this Order, which are desirable because of considerations of public safety and convenience during the event, will be in operation when indicated by signs.

Exceptions will apply to any vehicle which is being driven upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or an event steward; an emergency services vehicle; or an authorised vehicle associated with the organisation of the event. Alternative routes will be signed in an appropriate manner.
